

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

REPORTING

- End of semester reports are issued at end of Term Two and Term Four.
- Parent interviews take place in Week Six of Term One and Term Three.



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SCHOOL UNIFORM

- The Broadbeach State School Uniform Policy reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school.
- Our uniform policy is consistent with health and safety and anti-discrimination legislation.
- Broadbeach State School dress code offers gender neutral uniform options for all students.

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FORMAL DRESS UNIFORM

- Purple and white checked dress shirt
- <u>Plain black</u> school shorts / skorts / skirt
- Logos, stripes and images are not permitted on 'non-uniform' items and must be of similar style and length as school uniform.

- Logos, stripes and images are not permitted on 'non' uniform items and must be of similar style and length as school uniform



WINTER UNIFORM

 School jumper purchased from our uniform shop or a plain black jumper (No hoods or logos). These can be purchased at many department stores.

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 Hooded jumpers are not permitted as they breach Work Place Health and Safety requirements in the playground.

WINTER UNIFORM

- Plain black long pants (no logos) are acceptable during cooler months.
- Leggings / Opaque coloured stockings must only be worn under skirts / skorts.



FOOTWEAR

- Plain black sneakers / plain black leather shoes
- White socks only (no logos)
- If wearing stockings, socks are not necessary



JEWELLERY / ACCESSORIES

- Studs or Sleepers maximum of two earrings per lobe
- A watch (smart watches can be used for telling the time, however no other functionality is to be accessed between 8:45am and 3:00pm)

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Decorative jewellery is not permitted at school

JEWELLERY / ACCESSORIES

- Cultural / Religious / Medical jewellery
 (Should your child be required to wear an item
 for cultural, religious or medical reasons,
 please provide your written consent to your
 class teacher / Administration)
- Scrunchies / Wristbands present as a safety issue when worn on wrists.



JEWELLERY / ACCESSORIES

- To avoid students drawing unnecessary attention to themselves, being victimised or otherwise distracted from their studies, the following are also considered inappropriate for students and not permitted:
 - Nail polish
 - -False / Manicured nails
 - Make up

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-Visible stick on tattoos



HAIR

- Broadbeach State School students impress with who they are and what they do, not with which they adorn their bodies. In particular, the following are applicable:
 - -All medium to long hair must be tied up.
 - Small purple, black or white hair accessories are permitted.



HAIR

 Hair extensions, severe head shaving, partial head shaving, severe undercutting, streaking, other than natural colours, hair dying of unnatural, bright or fluorescent colours are **not** acceptable.

STUDENT SAFETY



- Parking is at a premium around the school it is recommended parents and carers park a couple of blocks away and walk the short distance to school.

- All students must wear appropriate safety helmets.




STUDENT SAFETY



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- The administration and staff carparks are strictly for staff use only – parents are not to access or transit in these areas.
- All Education Queensland schools are 'dog free zones" given allergy risks and fears of some students.

STUDENT SAFETY



- For emergent early departures, students must be signed out at the office by a parent / approved emergency contact.
- Children will not be released to anyone other than their parent or emergency contact, as listed on the school database.





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STUDENT SAFETY



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- Parents are not to park or collect students in the bus bay.
- Please Note NO PARKING in the "<u>Kiss 'n' Go</u>" Zones.
- Traffic must continue to proceed forward in the zone.
- Parents are to remain in their vehicle.
- Police regularly patrol the area during peak times.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION


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RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION

- Participation in RI is not compulsory students are allocated to RI based on information provided by parents on enrolment.

VALUES EDUCATION

- Non-participants of RI attend Values lessons taught by our classroom teachers.
- These lessons share similar core values and morals to be a good citizen from a nonreligious perspective.

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ANAPHYLAXIS and ALLERGIES

- Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction and is potentially life threatening.
- It must be treated as a medical emergency, requiring immediate treatment and urgent medical attention.
- Anaphylaxis is a generalised allergic reaction, which often involves more than one body system (e.g. skin, respiratory, gastro-intestinal and cardiovascular).

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ANAPHYLAXIS and ALLERGIES

- A severe allergic reaction or anaphylaxis usually occurs within 20 minutes to 2 hours of exposure to the trigger and can rapidly become life threatening.
- Although Broadbeach State School is not 'nut free' we request you be mindful of the products you pack for your child.



ANAPHYLAXIS and ALLERGIES

- We also request that any birthday cakes or treats are carefully considered and discussed with the class teacher in advance.
- It is important you keep your child's medical records up to date via the office.



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STUDENT ABSENCES



- Advise absence via the **QParents** app OR

- Education Queensland mandates, if your child is unwell, please keep them home.



STUDENT ABSENCES



- Where an absence notification has been received the absence will be recorded as 'Explained'
- Where an absence notification has not been received an SMS will be sent advising of the absence and seeking an explanation either by return SMS, phone call or email.

- All absences **must** be explained.
- Absence notifications prior to 8:00am are appreciated.
- Any student absence, late arrival or early departure impacts on a student learning.



EXTENDED ABSENCES



- Parents are asked to avoid any unnecessary absences in 2025.
- Applications for extended absences requiring an exemption from schooling will be processed according to the policy with approvals granted only to those meeting the criteria.



EXTENDED ABSENCES



- Please note: Family holidays **do not** qualify for exemptions.
- Absences not approved by the Principal will be recorded as "Unauthorized".
- Regular absenteeism without reasonable justification may be brought to the attention of Child Safety.

- English as an Additional Language or Dialect
- On enrolment, students are assessed in relation to their English language skills.

 Given students can be shy and take some time to settle these informal assessments can take a few weeks.

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EAL/D

- The EAL/D coordinator will speak regularly with the class teacher and determine the most appropriate support which could be in small groups, individual or within their class.
- At a primary school age the best English language support is immersion in the classroom and playground.
- Students learn best when exposed to real life English in real life contexts.


