# AUSTRALIAN CURRICULUM

- ▶ At Broadbeach State School we teach the Australian Curriculum.
- ▶ Curriculum implementation is guided and supported by the Queensland Department of Education.
- ▶ Our instructional framework (the way we deliver the curriculum) is unique and based on extensive research.

# AUSTRALIAN CURRICULUM

- ▶ Every teacher is trained and supported to deliver Explicit Instruction - this includes some Direct Instruction programs such as Spelling Mastery.
- ▶ This pedagogy (teaching style) is focused on mastery of content and skills and the fundamental reason for the significant academic progress and high achievements made by our students.



# STUDENT RESOURCE SCHEME (SRS)

- SRS is a convenient and efficient way for both parents and teachers to provide teaching materials for students.
- **SRS has been set at \$265.00 per student since 2017.**
- SRS covers all stationery, art supplies, consumables, photocopying, textbooks, sunscreen and online software.

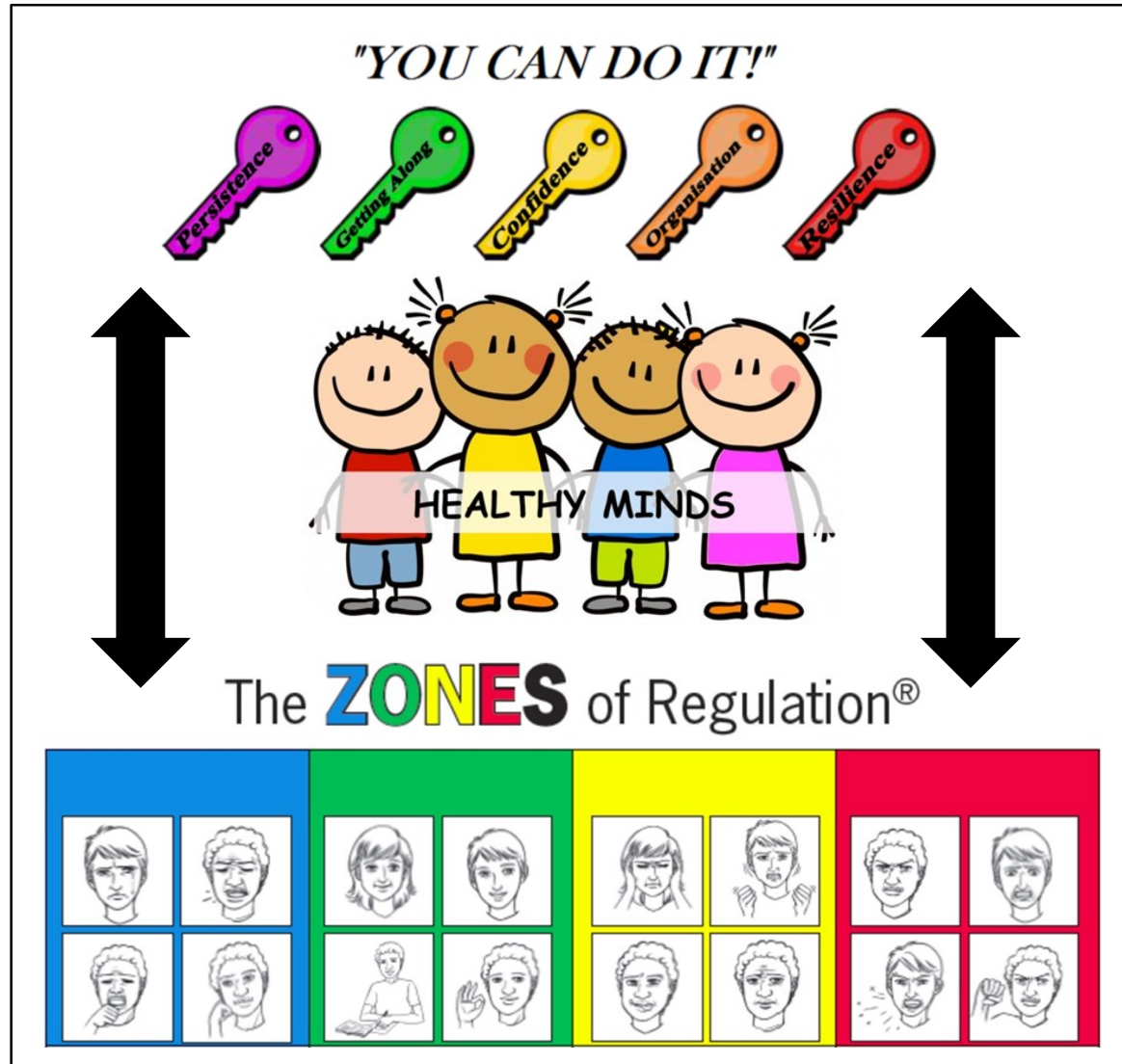

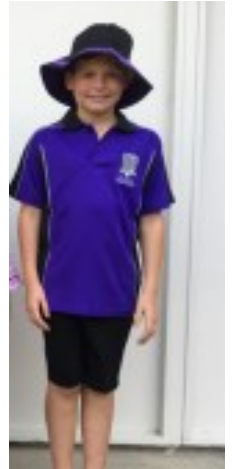
# FORMAL DRESS UNIFORM

- Logos, stripes and images are not permitted on 'non' uniform items and must be of similar style and length as school uniform



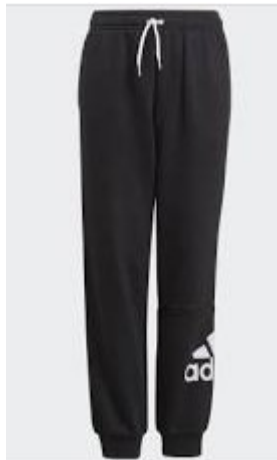
# WINTER UNIFORM

- School jumper purchased from our uniform shop or a **plain black** jumper (No hoods or logos). These can be purchased at many department stores.
- Hooded jumpers are **not permitted** as they breach Work Place Health and Safety requirements in the playground.



# WINTER UNIFORM

- Plain black long pants (no logos) are acceptable during cooler months.
- Leggings / Opaque coloured stockings must only be worn under skirts / skorts.



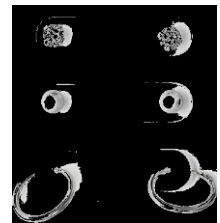
# FOOTWEAR

- Plain black sneakers / plain black leather shoes
- White socks only (no logos)
- If wearing stockings, socks are not necessary



# JEWELLERY / ACCESSORIES

- **Studs or Sleepers** - maximum of two earrings per lobe
- A **watch** (smart watches can be used for telling the time, however no other functionality is to be accessed between 8:45am and 3:00pm)
- Decorative jewellery is **not permitted** at school





# **JEWELLERY / ACCESSORIES**

- **Cultural / Religious / Medical jewellery**  
(Should your child be required to wear an item for cultural, religious or medical reasons, please provide your written consent to your class teacher / Administration)
- **Scrunchies / Wristbands** present as a safety issue when worn on wrists.

# JEWELLERY / ACCESSORIES

- To avoid students drawing unnecessary attention to themselves, being victimised or otherwise distracted from their studies, the following are also considered inappropriate for students and **not permitted**:
  - Nail polish
  - False / Manicured nails
  - Make up
  - Visible stick on tattoos

# HAIR

- Broadbeach State School students impress with who they are and what they do, not with which they adorn their bodies. In particular, the following are applicable:
  - Medium to long hair must be tied up.
  - **Small** purple, black or white hair accessories are permitted.

# HAIR

- Hair extensions, severe head shaving, partial head shaving, severe undercutting, streaking, other than natural colours, hair dying of unnatural, bright or fluorescent colours are **not** acceptable.

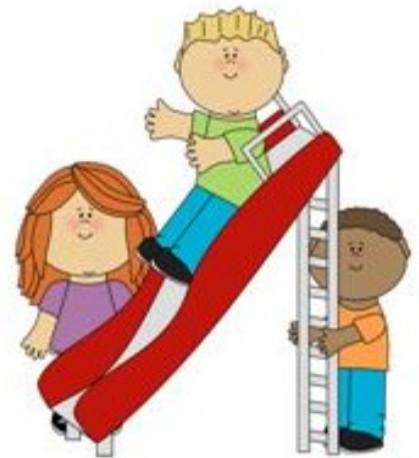

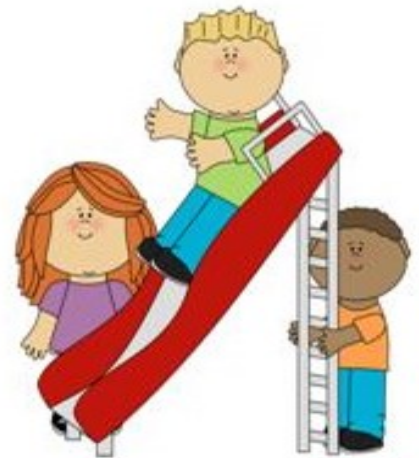

# STUDENT SAFETY

- Parking is at a premium around the school – it is recommended parents and carers park a couple of blocks away and walk the short distance to school.
- If utilising the “Kiss n Go” Zones please stagger arrivals and departures and move forward to the front of the zone.



# STUDENT SAFETY

- Students are to adhere to the instructions of crossing supervisors and duty staff.
- Bicycles / scooters / skateboards are not to be ridden on footpaths on school grounds.
- All students must wear appropriate safety helmets.
- Utilise provided bicycle racks and use locks.



# STUDENT SAFETY

- The administration and staff carparks are strictly for staff use – parents are not to access or transit these areas.
- Our school site is a ‘dog free zone” given the allergy risks and fears of some students.
- Parents and carers are reminded that playground forts are not supervised and are not be accessed before or after school by students or younger siblings.

# STUDENT SAFETY

- For **emergent** early departures students **must** be collected by an adult, and signed out at the office.
- Children will not be released to anyone other than their parent or emergency contact, as listed on the school database.



# STUDENT SAFETY

- Parents are not to park or collect students in the bus bay.
- Please Note – NO PARKING in the “Kiss n Go” Zones.
- Police regularly patrol the area during peak times.



# EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

## LOCKDOWN:

- **If in the classroom** - lock and close windows and doors, turn lights off and move under desks.
- **If out of the classroom** – report to the nearest room or follow directions announced over the public address system.

- On the alarm follow the teacher directions.

# RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION

- Queensland state schools embrace a multitude of cultural, religious and non-religious beliefs. Under the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006*, schools are to provide Religious Instruction (RI). RI is required to be consistent with legislation and Department of Education policies and procedures. All RI instructors must hold a blue card and participate in compulsory Student Protection and Code of Conduct training.



# RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION

- Students in Years 1-6 may attend **Religious Instruction (RI)** run by **volunteers** from a local faith group. A school staff member will be present during the delivery of RI.
- Participation in RI is **not compulsory** - students are allocated to RI based on information provided by parents on enrolment.

# VALUES EDUCATION

- **Non-participants of RI attend Values lessons taught by our classroom teachers.**
- These lessons share similar core values and morals to be a good citizen from a non-religious perspective.

# ANAPHYLAXIS and ALLERGIES

- Anaphylaxis is the **most severe form of allergic reaction** and is **potentially life threatening**.
- It must be treated as a medical emergency, requiring immediate treatment and urgent medical attention.
- Anaphylaxis is a generalised allergic reaction, which often involves more than one body system (e.g. skin, respiratory, gastro-intestinal and cardiovascular).



# ANAPHYLAXIS and ALLERGIES

- A severe allergic reaction or anaphylaxis usually occurs within 20 minutes to 2 hours of exposure to the trigger and can rapidly become life threatening
- Although **Broadbeach State School** is not 'nut free' we request you be mindful of the products you pack for your child



# ANAPHYLAXIS and ALLERGIES

- We also request that any birthday cakes or treats are carefully considered and discussed with the class teacher in advance.
- It is important you keep your child's medical records up to date via the office.

# QPARENTS

# EAL/D

- English as an Additional Language or Dialect
- On enrolment, students are assessed in relation to their English language skills.
- Given students can be shy and take some time to settle these informal assessments can take a few weeks.



# EAL/D

- The EAL/D coordinator will speak regularly with the class teacher and determine the most appropriate support which could be in *small groups, individual or within their class*.
- At a primary school age the best English language support is immersion in the classroom and playground.
- Students learn best when exposed to real life English in real life contexts.

# COMMUNICATION

- Communication should be planned in advance other than quick questions or vital information before or after school.
- Communication must be at mutually convenient times and respectful of teacher planning and preparation.
- Formal feedback will be provided through Parent-Teacher Interviews at the end of Term 1 and 3.
