Principal's Message



If you are a parent or carer who always has your child at school on time, prepared to learn and, do not expect collection prior to 3pm (unless there is an emergency or specialist appointment), thank you. Your commitment enhances the efficiency of our school's operation and maximises the learning for both your child and those in

their class. On behalf of those who teach and those who support the teaching, I extend gratitude for your adherence to the Parent Code of Conduct and respect for our core business of teaching and learning.

Last week, I had the opportunity to meander through the eating area where the younger students had congregated for lunch. The wonderful variety of healthy food in lunchboxes on display was very impressive. So much so that I was tempted to offer to assist some of the students in the consumption process. I could tell that considerable time and effort had been expended in preparing these delights and I commend those of you at home whose job it is to prepare for school lunches daily. A diet of healthy food contributes very positively to learning and

while your children probably don't appreciate it now, they will thank you later.

The official count of students on the census day was 1159. This represents a nett increase of only 11 since the beginning of last year. The largest cohort is Year 4 with 184 and the smallest is Prep with 150. We will be monitoring our enrolments throughout the year as we develop plans for additional classroom accommodation for the coming years.

The **Parent information sessions** last week provided an opportunity for you to learn more about your child's teacher and the operation of their classroom. The additional information sent home last Monday provided **a school-wide snapshot.** This information has been stored on our website for your reference throughout the year.

Healthy competition is certainly something that is evident in our school community. We enjoy setting targets and celebrating when we reach them. Tapping into these competitive juices I extend a challenge this week to all families. I am monitoring the respective percentages of QParent accounts for each year level. As you can see below Year 3 families are currently the frontrunners. If you haven't registered, please do so to boost your child's year level percentage and reap the benefits of the app .

Partnership-Supporting the Diverse Learner

Parents as their children's first teachers play an essential role, as equal partners, in the education they receive at school. Parent engagement in school communities can improve students' self-esteem, school attendance, behaviour and student achievement. It is important to inform the classroom teacher of any therapies or professional interventions your child receives outside of school. Equally, it is important to share any challenges. This sharing of information increases the team supporting your child and allows a deeper understanding of the little person in the school setting. Often, this information is

enough to allow quality, subtle differentiated adjustments giving your child the best start to the new year. If your child requires a more targeted approach, please begin these conversations early. Remember, a school teacher is a qualified professional who not only has a deep understanding of the diverse learner, they also support the social emotional needs of their students.

School Lunchtime Groups

The Stillness Space is a lunchtime activity that gives students the opportunity to engage in a range of mindful activities including drawing, colouring and breathing exercises, etc. The program runs Monday to Friday in the Library Community Room during play times. Prep to Year 2 - 1:30 to 1:55 and Year 3 to 6 - 1:55 to 2:15. All students welcome. The Stillness Space is run by the Guidance Officer, Psychologist and Family Support.

The Kindness Club, organised by the School Psychologist, is held on Monday at first break in the Library Community Room during play time. Students are able to engage in a range of activities that promote gratitude and build friendship and social/ emotional skills. All students welcome.

From the Psychologist

Mindfulness for Kids

Mindfulness is the state of being fully present in your surroundings. That means you are noticing and experiencing fully what is going on around you in a non-judgement manner. Sometimes, with our busy lives, this is easier said than done! Kids can benefit greatly from mindfulness, structured or unstructured as it can decrease anxiety, increase happiness and improve emotional regulation. There are some fun ways you can incorporate mindfulness into your daily routines to help. See below for some ideas. There is no wrong way to practise mindfulness as long as you are 'zooming' your focus to your current experience without judgement.

- Five Senses Mindfulness: Kids can 'zoom in' on each of their senses to experience their surroundings
 - o Name 5 things you can see
 - o Name 4 things you can touch
 - o Name 3 things you can hear
 - o Name 2 things you can smell
 - o Name 1 thing you can taste
- Mindfulness Safari: This works best went kids can get outside into nature and be an 'explorer', describing things as if they've seen them for the first time. Some examples of questions to ask:
 - o What bugs can I see? What colours/shapes are they? How do they move?
 - o What plants can I see? What do their flowers smell like?
 - o How does the ground feel under my shoes? What sort of noise do my steps make?
- Mindful Breathing (belly breathing)
 - o Place your hands on your belly
 - o Breathe in through your nose for 3 seconds, counting 1,2,3 in your head
 - o Breathe out through your mouth for 3 seconds, counting 1,2,3 in your head
 - o Continue for 3-5 minutes
 - o Notice the sensations of your breath and how your belly/hands move with each breath. What does it sound like? Are the breaths long or short? Etc.
 - o Smiling Mind is also an app that is a great resource


Book Review

A REMINDER: The option of splitting invoices 50/50 is no longer available. Education Queensland guidelines state that it is a matter for the parents to determine who pays the invoices. If there is a payment arrangement between the parents that has not been adhered to, that is a matter for the parents to resolve between themselves.

Student Resource Scheme 2023

We have been operating this scheme at Broadbeach State School for a number of years with positive feedback from parents and carers in regard to efficiency and value for money.

The SRS Participation Agreement Form you have already signed applies for the duration of your student's enrolment at the school, however parents who are participating in the scheme can choose to opt out from the SRS in future years by completing a new form. Any new Participation Agreement Form submitted and received by the school will supersede the previous form lodged. Therefore, should you not wish to participate in the SRS, the invoice will be credited when you return a Participation Agreement Form with the **NO** box ticked. The PAF is available on our website.

Given the purchasing power of the school, we are able to negotiate significant bulk discounts, particularly in the area of online programs and textbooks. As an example, the parent/carer cost of annual single user licences for Mathletics is \$99, Maths Online \$197 and Literacy Planet \$95. These licences exceed \$300 alone. As such, our SRS offers exceptional value

for families. We commend the SRS to you and look forward to your participation in 2023.
