School Opinion Survey 2025

The suite of School Opinion Surveys is undertaken each year by the Department of Education to obtain opinions about our school from families, school staff and students in target year levels (5, 6, 8 and 11). The surveys will help identify what we are doing well, and understand where we can improve. The survey invitation has been emailed and is titled School Opinion Survey for parents and caregivers, 2025.

Each school family has received one email invitation from the Department of Education to complete

the Parent/Caregiver Survey. The survey is anonymous, and the results are reported in ways that an individual's response can be identified by the school.

Parents/Caregivers are encouraged to complete the survey. The survey can be completed via computers, tablets or smart phones with an internet connection.

For Parents/Caregivers who do not have access to the internet school computers/tablets will be available. Parents/caregivers who experience difficulties accessing the survey can request a new survey from the School Opinion Survey team via email schoolopinionsurvey@qed.qld.gov.au.

It is important that as many parents/caregivers as possible complete the survey so we can get a well-rounded data source.


In the event that your child is absent, please advise the school via one of the avenues below:

These visits are a wonderful acknowledgment of the excellent teaching and learning happening every day at Broadbeach. Our international colleagues are here specifically to see how we explicitly teach to ensure students are engaged and making strong progress in their learning.

This is a fantastic opportunity to showcase the high-quality work happening in our classrooms and to share ideas that benefit students-both here and abroad. We're proud that Broadbeach is being recognised as a leader in education and excited to continue learning and growing through these valuable connections.

School Academic Data

Over the past week, our teachers have been meeting with Heads of Sub-School to ensure we are meeting the needs of every individual student. These meetings are an important part of our targeted teaching approach, allowing staff to review and analyse recent summative assessment data alongside ongoing monitoring tools and classroom observations.

By aligning this information, teachers can make informed decisions about how to best support, extend, and challenge each student in their class. It's one of the key ways we ensure that intervention and support at Broadbeach are based on data, not guesswork.

When reviewing our whole-school data for Semester 1, we are proud to share that 93% of students achieved a passing grade in Mathematics and 92% in English. This is an outstanding result for a school of over 1200 students.

More importantly, we are equally proud of the individual growth and progress students are making every day. At Broadbeach, every learner matters, and we are committed to continuing this work to ensure every student achieves their personal best.

Reminder: Specialist Questionnaire Requests

Just a reminder that throughout the school year, teachers may be asked to complete questionnaires such as the Vanderbilt, Conners, or ABAS to support medical or developmental assessments for students.

These forms provide valuable insights and contribute to a fuller understanding of a child's needs. While teachers aim to complete these promptly, please allow up to two weeks for processing.

To ensure privacy and comply with Department of Education guidelines:

A **Consent to Share Information** form must be completed by the parent or guardian before any information is shared.

This form details:

- · What information will be shared
- · Who it will be shared with
- The purpose of sharing
- · How long the consent is valid
- The right to withdraw consent at any time

Our Guidance Officer or Head of Special Education will assist with this process.

Please note:

Teachers are only able to complete **paper-based** questionnaires. Online forms or survey links cannot be used. Once completed, the school will email the form directly to the nominated specialist.

Gratitude for Wellbeing

In the hustle and bustle of everyday life, it's easy to get caught up in stress, endless to-do lists, and everyday challenges. Taking time to practise gratitude—recognising and appreciating the good in our lives—can make a big difference. Research shows that regular expressions of gratitude are linked to increased happiness, better health, greater resilience, and stronger relationships.

Here are a few simple ways to bring more gratitude into your day. This list is not exhaustive – everyone can practise gratitude in their own personal way.

- Send a note of thanks: A quick email, text, or handwritten note to someone you appreciate can brighten their day (and yours!).
- 2. **Reflect on the positives**: Each evening, take a moment to think of three good things that happened. You might jot them down, share them aloud, or just reflect quietly.
- 3. Be present: Practise mindfulness by tuning into your surroundings. Enjoy a mindful walk, enjoy your meal without distractions, or simply take in the view from your window as if it's the first time you've seen it.

August, they should be back by 9.30am.



Griffith University - What helps and hinders school attendance?

A team of researchers from Griffith University are interested in understanding what helps and hinders young people in attending and participating in school.

We know that non-attendance is higher for autistic students than non-autistic students, with previous research suggesting that autistic children, on average, miss a third of their schooling. It's important that we begin to find out what helps and hinders autistic young people in attending school, so we can begin to provide supports and interventions to students who wish to attend school but can't.

We have previously interviewed members of the Australian autism community, including teachers, autistic adults and parents of autistic young people, who support autistic students who are experiencing school non-attendance.

Now we need to hear from autistic young people about what makes it hard for them to get to school and compare this to otherwise neurodivergent children, and also neurotypical children.

Does your child feel overly fearful, anxious, or worried in certain situations?

Many children can feel anxious, fearful, or worried in certain situations. In most situations this is a normal emotion when faced with something threatening. Everyone can feel anxious from time to time. However, some children experience anxiety more intensely or more often than others and it stops them from having fun, going to school, or getting the most out of their life.

Take Action is an evidence-based program for 7- to 12-year-olds experiencing anxiety. Each child session takes approximately 1 hour, and the program runs over 10-12 weeks (either in-person or online). The program also includes six 1-hour sessions for parents/carers to provide additional education and support on managing children's anxiety.

All children receive a comprehensive assessment before and after the program, and all child and parent/carer workbooks and materials to practice Take Action skills at a home are provided. The project hat full ethics approval from the Griffith University Human Research Ethics Committee (HREC: 2023/381).

Saver Plus is a program designed to help <u>eligible</u> families develop essential financial skills and build savings for education costs.


