- ➤ "Uniform" School ratified by P&C Association




Attendance


- > Every minute counts instruction is systematic
- > Target of 95%
- > Unauthorised absences
- > Individual and class recognition of positive attendance
- ➤ Do not attend if unfit advise office (phone, Qparents, email)
- > Same day reporting of unexplained absences
- > Punctuality = respect




Enrolment Management Plan

Early and delayed entry to Prep

The decision about when a child enrols in Prep is extremely important and should be made in the child's best educational interests to enable a positive and successful start to school.

Prep eligibility

Prep eligibility for children is from the beginning of the school year in which they will reach the age of 5 years by 30 June. All Queensland children are required to undertake Prep, prior to commencing Year 1.

Early or delayed entry to Prep are options which may be considered in specific circumstances and where it is in a child's best educational interests.

Early entry to Prep

Early entry to Prep is only possible if the child meets all the legislative conditions set out in Part 4, Section 17 of the Education (General Provisions) Regulation 2017 🗷 .

A child who is younger than the prescribed age for Prep is only able to commence school early if:

- they turn 5 years by 31 July in the year they propose to attend Prep **and** the school principal is satisfied that the child is ready for education in the Prep year
- they have started education in another state or country that is equivalent to the Prep year **and** the school principal is satisfied that the child is ready for education in the Prep year.

A program that is equivalent to the Prep year is a program that is full-time, school-based, and has a defined curriculum in the year prior to Year 1.




Supportive Parent Body

- use words to ask for help







Emotional Resilience

Thinking

- Puzzles; dice games; memory games

Oral Language is the key

- Engage them in conversation (back & forth)
- Read; sing; question and talk.







Oral Language



- engage your child in conversation
- listen to them ask them why?
- help them recount the events of the day
- repeat phrases and pronounce correctly

GETTING READY FOR PREP

- ➤ **Visit the school in advance** visit the website, look at photos and discuss the school
- > Talk to your child about procedures and routines be organised
- ➤ **Teach the basics** take simple messages, name items, greetings, manners
- > Promote literacy and numeracy read to them
- > **Prepare for separation** sleep overs, stay with grandparents/family/friends
- > Confidence ensure they know their name and can talk about themselves and things they like to do
- > Be supportive but be prepared to let go have an exit plan for self



Learning through challenge

- > Significant challenges will be met and conquered by students in Prep
- > They will learn to be organised, persistent, resilient, confident and to get along with others
- > They need you to help them by giving them the latitude to "fail"
- "Helicopter" "Curling"
- > Students will own their own behaviour
- > Acknowledge and ask, "what do you plan to do?"



Curriculum and Signature Instruction

- > Australian Curriculum
- > Targeted teaching based on Zone of Proximal Development
- > Explicit and Direct Instruction
- > Short to long-term memory
- > Frequent checking for understanding
- > "Healthy Minds"
- > Reporting face-to-face and written twice each year



Inclusion

- > Abilities, disabilities, cultures
- > Intervention programs based on analysis of needs
- > Targeted deployment of resources
- > Collaboration with outside professionals
- > Our school is inclusive responding to individual needs
- > Special Education Program led by Caroline works with teachers and parents



Supermodel

- > Children watch you!
- > Expect that each member of the school community is a supermodel



Highly trained and dedicated staff members

- > Teachers are experts in education
- > Teachers work together to address learning needs
- > Teachers are supported by Heads of Sub-schools
- > Paraprofessionals support teachers through provision of instruction



Some advice

- > Trust the teachers and the school we are the experts in this space
- > Build a relationship with your child's teacher and communicate
- > Stay abreast of what is going on newsletter, website, apps
- ➤ Connect with other parents especially some who have older students
- ➤ Take care with social media you and your children
- > Read to your children, teach them nursery rhymes, sing
- ➤ Talk with your children, play with them ask lots of questions
